#### B. Any other issues relevant to MDM implementation

MI may give a maximum 2 page note, on any other issues, relevant to MDM implementation, not covered above.

- MDM was not served regularly as the food grains were not available due to non availability of grains at the govt, depots. Extent of delay was 2-3 weeks during the year 2010-11. In rural areas schools were functional for 180-210 days but Mid Day Meal was served for 120-140 days only. In District Pulwama food grains allotted were 976.61 MTs and only 480.82 MTs were lifted and utilized.
- 2. No. of cooks cum helpers engaged in almost all schools is not as per govt. of India norm.
- Though quantity and quality of food is found satisfactory but during MI's visit to different schools, it was found that either rice with vegetable or rice with dal is served. No leafy vegetables are served.
- 4. No micro nutrients or de-worming medicine is given to students in any of the schools visited by MI. Infact MDM in charge or school authorities are found ignorant about administering de-worming medicine and micro nutrients to the school children, or maintaining a School Health Card for each child.
- Cooking cost and honorarium to cooks is released after two to three months delay. School authorities manage to serve MDM to students but at times it is very difficult to do so due to paucity of funds.

	As discussed with the parents and the school teachers the first incidental benefit was that the health of the weak children and attendance of the children of the categories and the BPL children has considerably developed to a higher extent particularly among the girl child and the children in the SC/ST and other backward and hilly areas.		

#### B. Any other issues relevant to MDM implementation

### *MI may give a maximum 2 page note, on any other issues, relevant to MDM implementation, not covered above.*

As observe by the MI there is no regular monitoring of MDM in the school at zonal or District level to minimize the interruption in the regularity in the MDM programme. The involvement of VEC or the community is almost negligible in maximum schools to monitor and supervise the quality, quantity regularity in serving MDM. No orientations of VECs or meetings are conducted by the SMC VEC on MDM or other academic matters.

The regularity of food grains has been affected due to turmoil, non cooperation of the rice depot / rice distribution units at village level, delays in the supply orders from the zone level to the schools. There is no buffer stock maintained in the schools at all. The limited supply of rice containers and cooking utensils has also hampered the guality of meals to the children which is not properly been taken care of by the higher authorities at zone or District level. The constitution of monitoring teams at zonal and District level and schedule of monitoring at zonal lever is the dire need for control of the maintenance and supply of MDM in schools. The irregularity and lack of advance payment of cooking cost and honorarium to the cooks has been observe in most of the schools. The foodgrains is not delivered in the schools and is being lifted by the schools authorities in all the visited schools. Most of the Primary schools do not have kitchen sheds and the schools are facing the problem of the storage of foodgrains which they keep in the classrooms or in the house of the cooks. The quality of MDM gets affected due to carriage from the house of the cook to the schools by which the MDM gets cooled adds to the delaying time in serving. The MI observed that in 25% of the Visited schools the Kitchen sheds are available but are non functional due several reasons such as damaged doors walls windows by rain water seepage, under renovation work. The MDM is cooked either outside the school or somewhere else. In four schools the kitchen shed are being constructed as per revised rates of Rs. 1.42 lacs.

There is a very good response by the community, parents, teachers & students with regard to MDM programme it has not only increased the enrolment but also developed the spirit of community involvement in the educational process .but a lot is yet to be done on account of proper implementation of the programme without any delay &continuous supervision is also to be ensured. The authorities must ensure the objective for which the programme is being implemented. There are number. of problematic areas upon which research is needed to be conducted which has unfortunately not been done so far. There should be one person wholly& solely responsible for MDM programme in each school & not a teacher. Because a teacher if involved in MDM programme like lifting of grains, account of cooking charges etc is deviating him from his teaching work, as has been reported by all the teachers in the schools. There should be also a separate and furnished place for taking of MDM.
