



**Minutes of the meeting of Programme Approval Board - Mid Day Meal (PAB-MDM)
on 13th June, 2018 – NCT of DELHI (with Legislature)**

The meeting of the Programme Approval Board-Mid-Day Meal (PAB-MDM) was held in New Delhi on 13th June, 2018. The list of participants in the meeting is enclosed at *Annexure-I*.

The agenda before the PAB-MDM was:

- i. To review the status and progress of the implementation of Mid-Day Meal Scheme of NCT of Delhi.
- ii. To consider the Annual Work Plan and Budget (AWP&B) 2018-19 proposal of NCT of Delhi for MDM Scheme.

2. Mrs. Ritu Aggarwal, Deputy Secretary MDM and Member Secretary, PAB, welcomed the members of PAB-MDM and other participants. She requested Shri V Shashank Shekhar, Joint Secretary (EE.I), to make his opening remarks. Joint Secretary (EE.I) appreciated Delhi Government's good practices/initiatives viz. Regular testing of Food Samples by NABL Accredited Laboratory - FICCI Research and Analysis Center in GNCT of Delhi, Training imparted to 60 Cook-cum-Helpers as Master trainer by FSSAI.

3. Shri Sandeep Kumar Secretary, Education, Government of NCT of Delhi could not attend PAB-MDM meeting as he had to be present in Hon'ble High Court of Delhi. Mrs. Saumya Gupta, Director of Education, Government of NCT of Delhi briefed the PAB about the steps taken by the GNCT of Delhi under MDM and made a presentation on the performance of Mid-Day Meal Scheme during 2017-18 and the initiatives taken by the GNCT of Delhi for improving the effectiveness of the scheme along with proposals for 2018-19. Dr. Mridula Sircar, *Senior Consultant*, TSG-MDM also presented an analysis of the performance of the GNCT of Delhi in the implementation of Mid-Day Meal Scheme during 2017-18.

4. The following issues were discussed during the meeting:

4.1 Coverage of children: 62% of the enrolled children at primary stage and 63% of the enrolled children at upper primary stage have availed MDM on an average basis during 2017-18. Joint Secretary (EE.I) mentioned that as compared to last year, the coverage of children at primary stage has significantly gone down to 62% from 67% which is a cause of concern. Director

Education, Government of NCT of Delhi informed that on an average the rate of attendance of children in schools is 70% in Delhi which is actual and real. The reason for low coverage is long absenteeism apparently of migrant population. However, she mentioned that all children attending schools are availing MDM daily. She further informed that there is no fake or duplicate enrolment of children in schools of Delhi. JS (EE.1) advised the GNCT officials to take necessary steps to enhance the coverage of enrolled children at primary and upper primary levels. Director Education, Government of NCT of Delhi assured to take up necessary measures to monitor the attendance and increase coverage of children under MDMS.

4.2 Testing of food samples: Joint Secretary (EE.I), mentioned that 56 tested food samples have been found below norms and further inquired about the measures and penalties imposed upon the service provider in case of samples found below norms. Director Education, Government of Delhi informed that MDM in the schools of Delhi, is served by NGOs/Service Providers. The samples of Mid Day Meal are tested by NABL Accredited Laboratory, FICCI Research and Analysis Centre. She informed that in case of supplying substandard/contaminated meal to the children, very prompt action is taken by the Directorate of Education against the Service Providers such as imposing of penalty/compensation to the children/cancellation of agreement, etc. She further informed that regular inspections are done by Ministers and senior IAS officers including people from civil society. Joint Secretary (EE.I), advised GNCT officers to consciously monitor the scheme, pick up at least 10% of the samples and test in reputed labs so that safe and nutritious food is served to children.

4.3 Delay in Release of Funds to implementing agencies: Joint Secretary (EE.I), observed that there is a delay of 3-4 months in releasing funds to implementing agencies since last three years and also expressed concern over non release of 2nd Instalment of Central Assistance of Rs. 3624.29 Lakh for 2017-18 due to less release of mandatory matching State share of Rs. 1636.15 Lakh. Director Education, Government of Delhi informed that during FY 2015-16, the funding pattern of all schemes including Mid Day Meal was changed from 100% Central Assistance to 60:40 sharing basis between Central and State. As a result GNCT of Delhi could not release matching State share on time and the same funds were released in the next FY 2016-17. During FY 2017-18, since financial liabilities had to be cleared, hence the released funds fell short off. She further informed that now the full and final mandatory State share has been released. She assured that the requisite sanction order and revised expenditure statement will be submitted soon along with the request to release their 2nd Instalment of Central assistance pertaining to 2017-18. Joint Secretary (EE.1) advised the GNCT officers to streamline the fund flow mechanism so that funds reach in time to the implementing agencies for smooth implementation of MDMS.

- 4.4 Social Audit.** Director Education, Government of NCT of Delhi informed that process has been initiated to engage an agency for conduct of Social Audit for Mid Day Meal Scheme. Joint Secretary (EE.1), advised to conduct Social Audit at the earliest and share the report with MHRD.
- 4.5 Rashtriya Bal Swasthya Karykram (RBSK):** Dr. Mridula Sircar, informed that during the year 2017-18, the health check up has been carried out for only 52% of the enrolled children. Agency wise statistics shows that in Directorate of Education (DOE) and East MCD, the health check up of enrolled children was less than 50%. Director, GNCT of Delhi stated that Mohalla clinic was put in place to do the health check -up. But due to some administrative dispute within the Government the Mohalla clinics were closed down resulting in lesser health checkups. Another reason for lower coverage is shortage of medical staff. JS (EE.1) advised the GNCT officials to ensure that 100% enrolled children are covered under RBSK and also share the agency wise report after every quarter of the year with MHRD. Director Education, GNCT of Delhi, assured to tie-up with medical staff available under Ayush Department to do the health check-up of all enrolled children and send the report to MHRD.
- 4.6 Provision of safe drinking water:** Joint Secretary (EE.1) observed that 2967 schools have safe drinking water facility and 2570 schools have water filtration facility. 2151 schools have RO water purifiers. He further observed that in most of the schools of South MCD and East MCD, RO water purifiers are not available. The source of drinking water is Jal Board supply or water tanks. Joint Secretary (EE.1) mentioned that water borne diseases are detrimental for child health, hence advised the GNCT officials to ensure that all schools especially schools under South MCD and East MCD have water filtration facility.
- 4.7 Honorarium to Cook –cum-Helpers.**
Director Education, GNCT of Delhi, informed that MDM is served through NGOs and all cook-cum-helpers have been engaged in the ratio of 50:50 at school and central kitchen level. Hence, payment to cook-cum-helpers is made through NGO concerned.
- 4.8 Details of total NGOs and centralized kitchens engaged for MDMS:**
Joint Secretary (EE.1) was informed that 53 NGOs/Service Providers from their 55 Semi Automated kitchens have been engaged for serving Mid Day Meal. He desired that GNCT of Delhi may share the complete profile of all NGOs working for MDMS with total number of schools and areas allotted to them with MHRD.

4.9 Management Monitoring and Evaluation

Dr. Mridula Sircar, informed that there is NIL Utilization of MME funds at school level. She added that as per MDM Guidelines 50% of the funds earmarked under MME are meant for school level utilization. Director Education, GNCT of Delhi informed that schools use funds available under Vidyalaya Kalyan Samiti for buying soaps, registers etc and are not aware of utilizing MME funds available at school level. She assured to send proper standing instructions and circular to all schools for utilization of MME funds.

4.10 Meeting of District level Steering cum Monitoring Committee: As per the information provided no meeting of District level Steering cum Monitoring Committee under the chairpersonship of the District Collector has taken place in any of the 13 districts. As per MDM guidelines at least one meeting per month should be held. JS (EE.I) expressed his concern on this and advised the State to ensure that these meetings are held regularly every month. Director Education, GNCT of Delhi assured to take necessary steps in this regard and issue directions to all District Collectors to monitor the implementation of the scheme regularly.

4.11 Use of Millets: JS (EE.I) mentioned that Ministry of Agriculture has decided to celebrate 2018-19 as 'Year of nutri cereals (Millets)'. He further suggested the GNCT of Delhi to explore the possibilities to introduce millets or any other traditional locally available nutritional grains in Mid Day Meal Scheme.

4.12 Data Entry on MIS-Web Portal: Joint Secretary (EE.I), observed mismatch in the data submitted through AWP&B and the data entered in the MDM-MIS web portal. He advised the UT officials to develop a mechanism to ensure accuracy and quality of the data entry in MDM-MIS. Director Education, GNCT of Delhi assured to send the State level MIS team to MHRD to check the mis-match and reconcile the data.

4.13 District wise data in AWP&B not provided as per MHRD AWP&B formats.

Dr. Mridula Sircar informed that only GNCT of Delhi is providing information on the performance of the MDM scheme agency wise. There are 6 agencies viz, DOE, 3MCDs, NDMC and Delhi Cantonment Board. Rest all other States/UTs are providing district wise information as per MHRD AWP&B formats. However, NCT of Delhi is providing district wise information on MIS-MDM Web Portal and on Automated Monitoring System. Director Education, GNCT of Delhi assured to correct the reporting system and provide data as per MHRD AWP&B formats.

4.14 Automated Monitoring System (AMS): It was observed that North MCD, South MCD, East MCD and DCB are not feeding daily beneficiary data in dashboard of Automated Monitoring System (AMS). On an Average only 50% schools have reported during the Year 2017-18. Director Education, GNCT of Delhi informed that the schools of DOE are only reporting on AMS at present. She further informed that Tech Mahindra, their IT vendor, had some legal issues with State Government which resulted in non reporting of data. However the issue is now resolved. She assured to make all efforts to report the data of all the schools regularly in AMS.

4.15 Ayushman Bharat: Joint Secretary (EE.I) mentioned about the importance of School Health component of recently launched programme of Ayushman Bharat. Dr Anindita Shukla, Senior Consultant, TSG-MDM, informed that under Ayushman Bharat, identified school teachers will be trained as 'Health and Wellness Ambassadors' who in turn will train the school children on Yoga & Meditation, health & hygiene, cleanliness and adolescent issues etc. She further added that provision of water purification systems of appropriate technology, Yoga & Meditation and provision of sanitary napkins for girl child in the schools are very important components in the service delivery part of School Health Component of Ayushman Bharat. Funds are also available in the programme of Menstrual Hygiene Programme of Ministry of Health and Family Welfare. JS (EE.I) advised the State to coordinate the efforts in this regard with the concerned departments and share the status with Dr Anindita Shukla.

4.16 Kitchen Garden: Director Education, GNCT of Delhi informed that there is no adequate space in the schools to develop kitchen gardens. Joint Secretary (EE.I) advised to set up kitchen gardens in schools in rural areas of Delhi where land is available. He further suggested that Horticulture Department, Krishi Vigyan Kendras (KVK) etc. may also be roped in for this purpose.

4.17 Additional Request of GNCT of Delhi

GNCT of Delhi informed that in order to improve the nutritional indices of growing children, following proposals are under process in Directorate of Education viz, Providing Mid Day Meal to the girl students of class 9th to 12th and providing bananas twice/thrice a week as a supplement with MDM. Director, Education GNCT of Delhi requested MHRD to issue directions to FCI to provide Fair Average Quality(FAQ) rice for the above purpose on the subsidized rates as applicable for MDMS.

5 PAB-MDM approvals for the year 2018-19

It was clarified that the quantification of resources is only an estimate for release of Central Assistance during 2018-19 under the MDM Scheme. The MDM Guidelines provide that every child attending an eligible institution is to be covered under the Scheme and shall be served

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mid-day meal on all school days. In case the NCT of Delhi finds that the average number of children availing mid-day meal and/or if the working days are more than the approved numbers by PAB-MDM, they may approach the GOI at any time with justification for additional Central Assistance.

After discussions with officials of NCT of Delhi and based on the performance during 2017-18 the PAB-MDM approved the following number of children, number of school days etc. for quantifying the Central assistance for NCT of DELHI

The GNCT of Delhi is advised to disseminate the approvals of the resources to all the field functionaries in the NCT of Delhi and districts so as to enable all the eligible institutions to ensure that every child attending an eligible school must be served hot cooked midday meals on all school days irrespective of the approvals of PAB-MDM.
7. The quantification of central assistance of **Rs. 9082.52 Lakh** has been done as per existing norms on the basis of number of children and working days approved by PAB-MDM for the year 2018-19. The Component- wise approval of funds for 2018-19 is enclosed at Appendix-1.
