- ii. Health check up is carried out for only 58% children.

- i. State Government is providing Egg once a week.
- ii. State Government is providing Rs.500/- additional Honorarium to CCH.
- iii. State Government is providing Rs. 4.00 lakh compensation on death of CCH to his/her family.
- iv. School Nutrition Gardens have been established in 1087 schools.

PART – General Information

Introduction:

National Programme of Mid-Day-Meal in Schools (MDMS) is a flagship programme of the Government of India aiming at enhancing enrolment, retention and attendance and simultaneously improving nutritional levels among children studying in Government, Local Body and Government-aided primary and upper primary schools and the Centers run under Education Guarantee Scheme (EGS)/Alternative & Innovative Education (AIE) and National Children Labor Project (NCLP) schools now called as Special Training Centers (STC) of all areas across the country.

PART- B Review of the Performance of the scheme during 2018-19

1. Coverage of children and PGI points:

The PAB-MDM has approved 81,13,637children at primary and 36,77,094 children at upper primary level, out of which 72,69,694 children at primary and 34,76,789 children at upper primary have availed Mid Day Meal on an average basis during the year 2018-19.

Under Performance Grading Index (PGI), the State of Bihar obtained score of 10 against the weight age of 10 for indicator No. 1.3.7 i.e. "% of elementary school's children taking MDM against target approved in PAB – in Govt. and aided schools".

2. School Working Days:

The PAB-MDM has approved 245 working days for both primary and upper primary level, out of which Mid Day Meal was served on 224 days at primary and 222 days at upper primary levels respectively. Under Performance Grading Index (PGI), the State of Bihar obtained score of 10 against the weightage of 10 for indicator No. 1.3.8 i.e. "% of days Mid Day Meal served against total working days – Govt. and aided elementary schools".

3. Kitchen cum store:

Central assistance of Rs. 45193.09Lakh has been released for construction of 66,550 Kitchen-cum-Stores. As on 31.3.2019, construction has been completed for 58,363Kitchen-cum-stores and construction work is in progress for 484 kitchen-cum-stores. The State has not started any construction work for kitchen-cum-stores in 7,703 schools. State was advised to complete the construction of remaining kitchen-cum-stores by 30.09.2019.

State has also proposed for repair of 35,266 kitchen-cum-stores with an outlay of Rs 3526.60 Lakh, which comprises of Rs 2115.96 lakh as central share and Rs 1410.64 lakh as State share.

4. Kitchen Devices (new as well as replacement):

Central assistance of Rs. 3597.80 lakh has been released towards procurement of 71,956 units of kitchen devices. The State has reported that all the sanctioned 71,956 units of kitchen devices have been procured. 67,561 units of kitchen devices were also sanctioned as replacement of kitchen devices, State has also procured all 67,561 units of kitchen devices.

The State has proposed replacement of 35,760 kitchen devices with an outlay of Rs6591.70lakh, which comprises of Rs. 3955.02 lakh as central share and Rs2636.68 lakh as State share.

5. School Nutrition Gardens:

State has informed that 1,087 schools are having Nutrition Gardens and setting up of Nutrition Gardens is in progress in 3,613 schools. it is proposed to develop Nutrition Gardens in 20,000 more schools with an estimated expenditure of Rs 1000.00 Lakh, comprising of Rs 600.00 lakh as central share and Rs400.00 lakh as State share under the 5% flexibility component.

5. School Health Programme (Rashtritya Bal SwasthyaKaryakram, Weekly Iron & Folic Acid Supplementation, National De-worming Day etc.) and Nutrition in convergence with other Ministries:

It was observed that health check up has been carried out for 1,05,63,932 (58%) children, out of total enrolment of 1,80,95,158children.

6. TithiBhojan:

The Concept of "TithiBhojan",a community participation programmeis not formally in practice in Bihar. The State was advised to encourage the practice of 'TithiBhojan' in the State. It was emphasized that 'TithiBhojan' is not a substitute to Mid - day Meal and this only supplements or complements Mid - Day Meal.

7. Training of Cook-cum-Helpers and other capacity building activities:

State has informed that out of total engaged 2,38,869 Cook-cum-Helpers, training has been imparted to all 2,38,869 Cook-cum-Helpers with the help of ISHP and UNICEF. The expenditure for these activities has been met from MME component.

8. Cooking Competition:

The State has proposed to organize cooking competitions at various levels i.e. Block level, District level and State level in all schools for promoting variety menu. Under this, nutritionists will examine the recipes to ensure compliance with nutrition standards as laid down in Mid-Day Meal guidelines, and the judges will also include children because they are the ones for whom the meal is being cooked. The expenditure for these activities will be met from MME component.

9. Supplementary nutritional items (milk, egg etc.):

The State informed that they are providing eggs to all children once a week from their own resources in addition to the Mid Day Meal.

10. Data Entry on MIS-Web Portal:

MDM-MIS portal captures information on critical indicators of MDMS. The annual data entry module captures master data on availability of kitchen-cum-stores, kitchen devices, no. of cook-cum-helpers engaged, mode of cooking etc. The monthly data entry module captures data on no. of days Mid Day Meal was served; number of meals served, honorarium paid to cook-cum-helpers engaged, no. of children received IFA tablets, no. of children screened under RBSK etc. The State of Bihar has completed annual and monthly data entry for 100% schools.

11. Status of implementation of Automated Monitoring System:

AMS has been put in place for real time monitoring of MDMS. Data on number of meals served on the particular day and reasons if meals not served are being captured from schools with no cost to school head masters/teachers. Out of 70,130 schools, daily data has been reported by 52,816schools i.e. 75% schools on Automated Monitoring System. In this regard, email alerts are being sent to all States/UTs on daily basis from NIC server.

12. Usage of Temples, Gurudwaras, Jails etc.:

The State has informed that measures are being taken to explore the possibilities for involving Temples, Gurudwaras, Jails for providing Mid Day Meal.

13. Centralized kitchens:

Centralized kitchens have been engaged for supplying meal to 8,22,485 children, covering 2,753 Schools in 12 districts. It was clarified that centralized kitchens can

be engaged for schools in urban areas only as per the National Food Security Act, 2013 and the Mid Day Meal Rules, 2015 (as amended till date).

14. Awareness generation activities:

State has informed that many activities like preparation of jingles for media propogation, newspaper advertisement etc. have been organised for awareness generation.

15. Social Audit:

Social Audit has not beenconducted in any Districts in 2018-19. The State was informed to initiate and scale up Social Audit to all the districts by effectively using the Social Audit Units (SAU) set up under MNREGS or any suitable reputed agency. The expenditure for these activities can be met from MME component.

16. Use of LPG:

LPG as fuel is being used in 61,203 (87% of schools). The State was advised to take adequate steps to ensure use of LPG in 100% schools. The State was advised to increase the coverage of LPG to the extent possible and also encourage smoke-less chulha, where LPG availability is difficult.

17. Meeting of District level Steering cum Monitoring Committee:

As per the information provided 38 meetings of District level Steering cum Monitoring Committee under the chairpersonship of the District collector have taken place.

18. Use of Millets / Coarse grains:

Ministry of Agriculture had decided to celebrate 2018-19 as 'Year of nutri cereals (Millets)'.Millets may continue to be used this year also. The State was suggested to explore the possibilities to introduce millets in Mid Day Meal Scheme.
