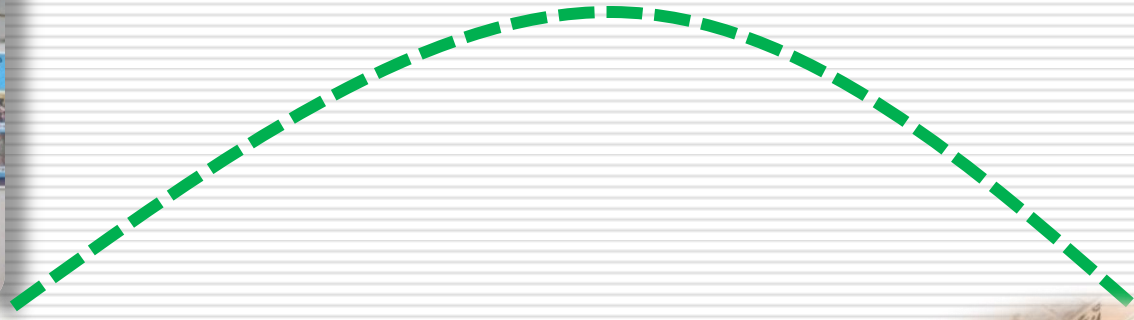
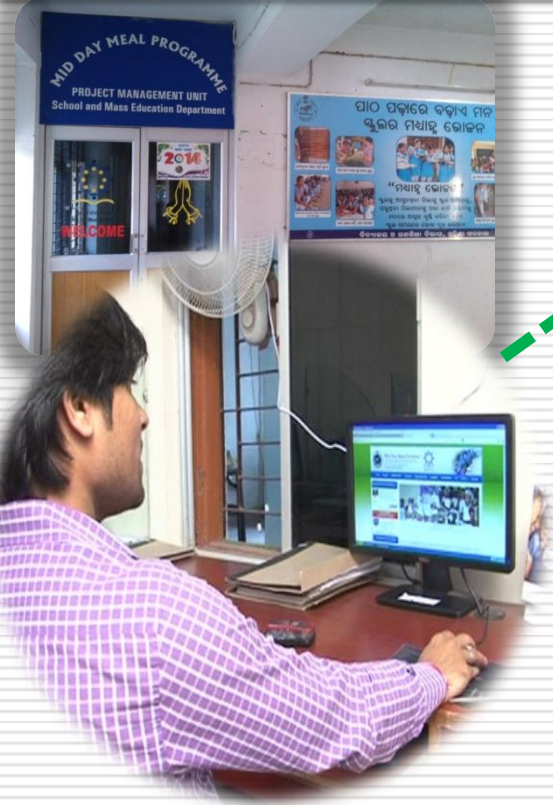

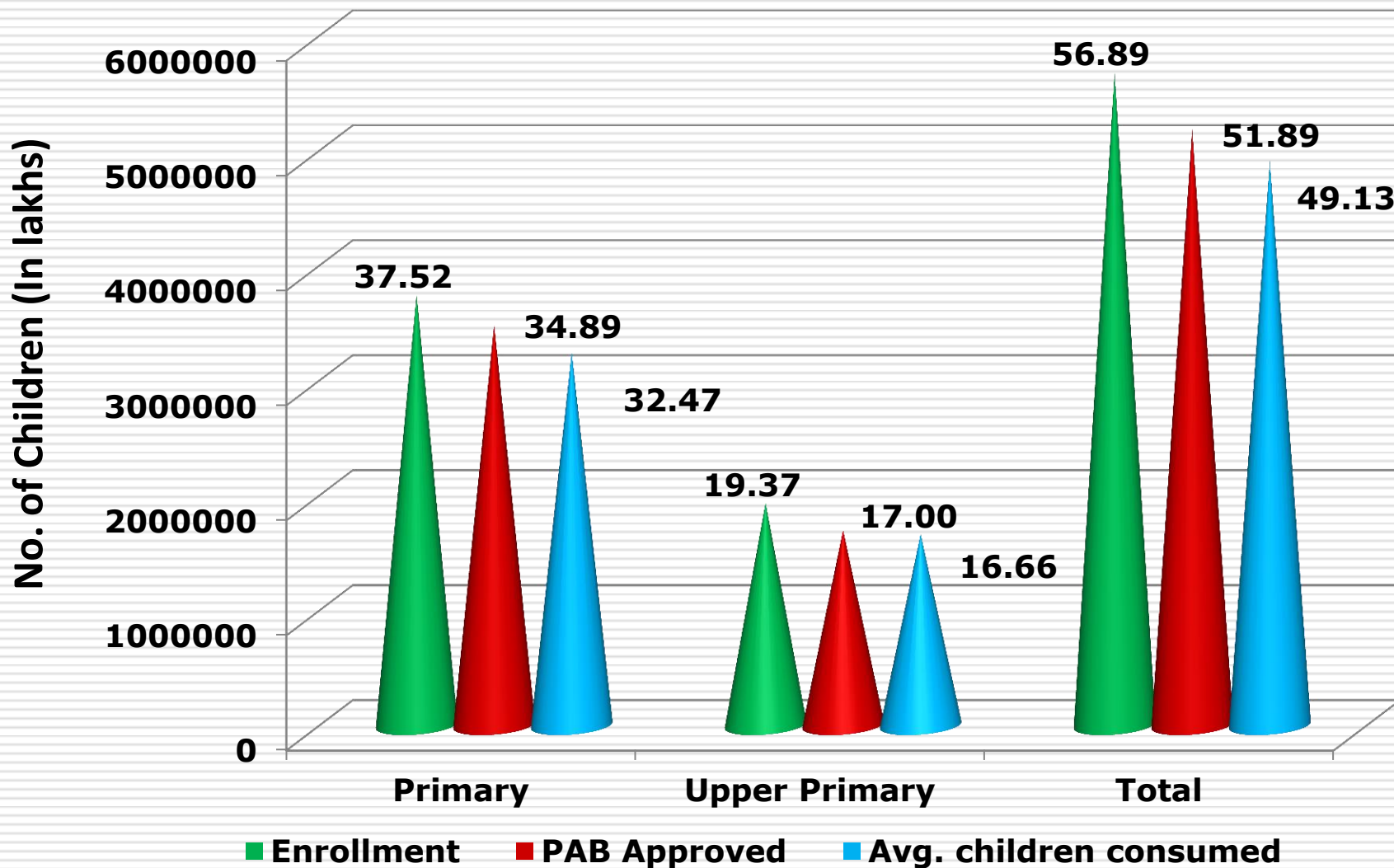

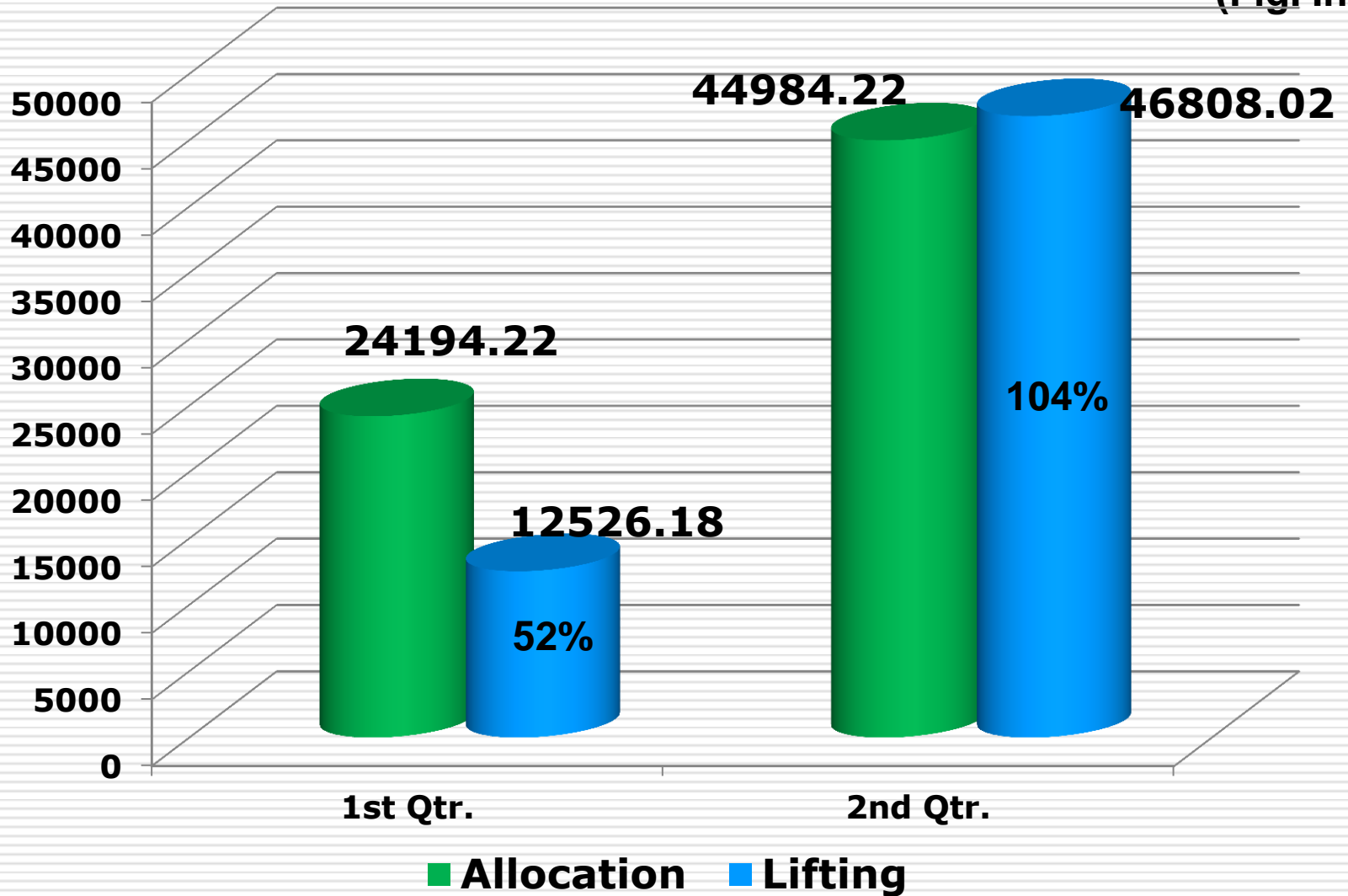


Allocation of food grains from State to District

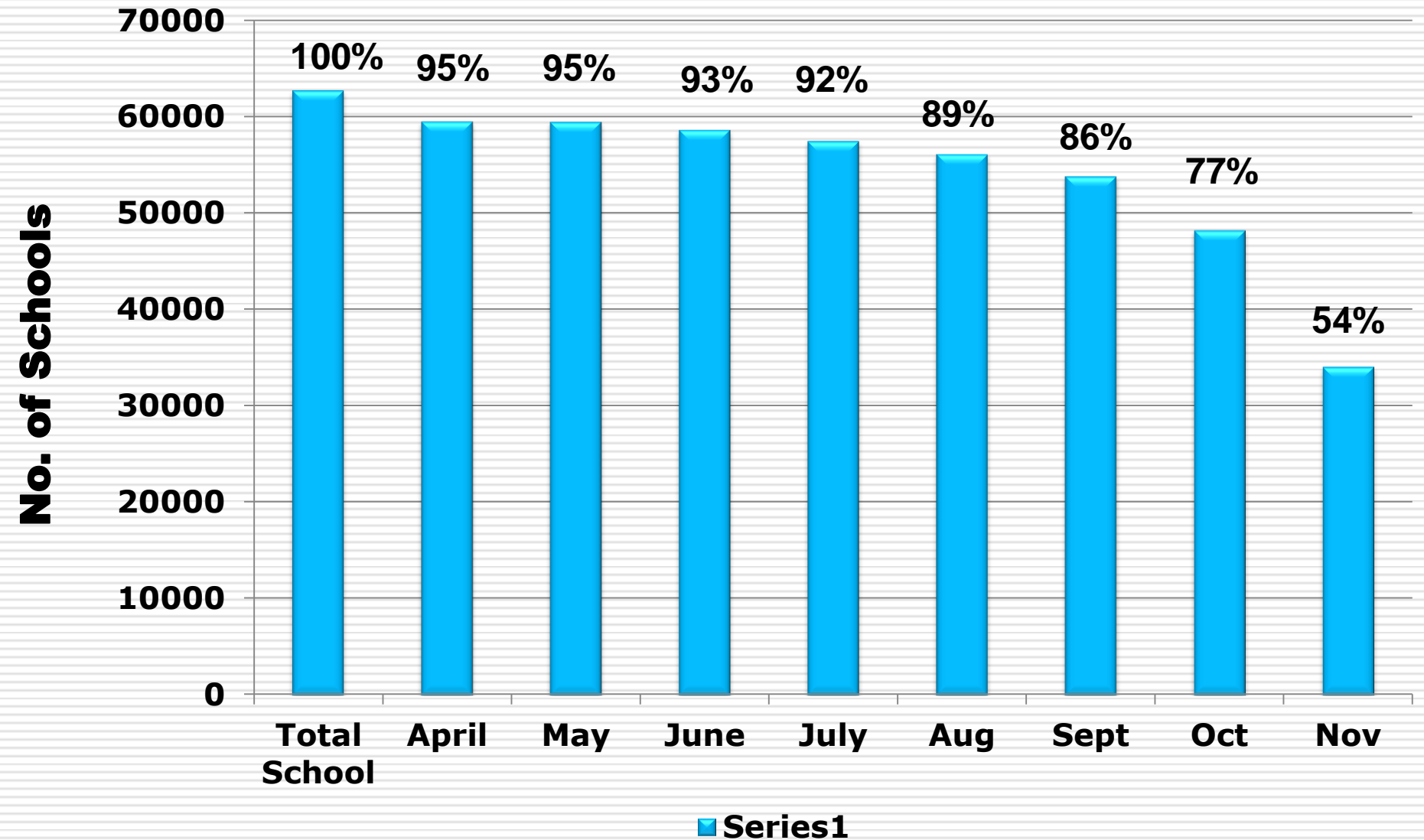

Madam/Sir,

As you were aware that the central kitchens as well as the school kitchens where Mid-Day Meal is prepared are covered under the Food Safety and Standards Act (FSSA) 2006. Furthermore, food testing at school point is mandatory as per the regulations of FSS Act 2006 under Mid-Day Meal programme. Keeping the intensity of the issue in mind and to avoid any kind of untoward incidents relating to food poisoning or food adulteration, State Project Management Unit, Mid-Day Meal, School and Mass Education Department, Govt of Odisha has decided to carry out the Food Testing under Mid-Day Meal in random manner in association with Food Safety Commission, Odisha.


Based on this, the Food Safety Officers appointed at district level will collect the food samples i.e. the hot cooked meal samples from the school point prepared in School Kitchen or Centralised Kitchens. And the preserved food sample collected from the school point would be analysed at the State FSSAI Laboratory to record the nutritive as well as biological value of the food.

Hence, all the District Education Officers are requested to facilitate the Food Safety Officers (including the vehicle support) in collection of the food samples from school point. It is further requested to the District Education Officers that the monthly plan should be a confidential one to make the mechanism more effective and transparent



RICE FORTIFICATION PROJECT IN GAJAPATI

- **Rice Fortification** : Iron Fortified Rice is being given to the 1,01,757 children across 1449 schools of Gajapati district for improving iron deficiency anemia.
- **Components of rice:** The Fortified Rice Kernels are blended at a ratio 1: 100 with the ordinary rice provided by the GoO.
- **Baseline Study and Mid-Term Study is over**
- **Findings** : Over all Anemia Prevalence in Gajapati District reduced from 62.9% (during baseline) to 58% at Mid-term evaluation.

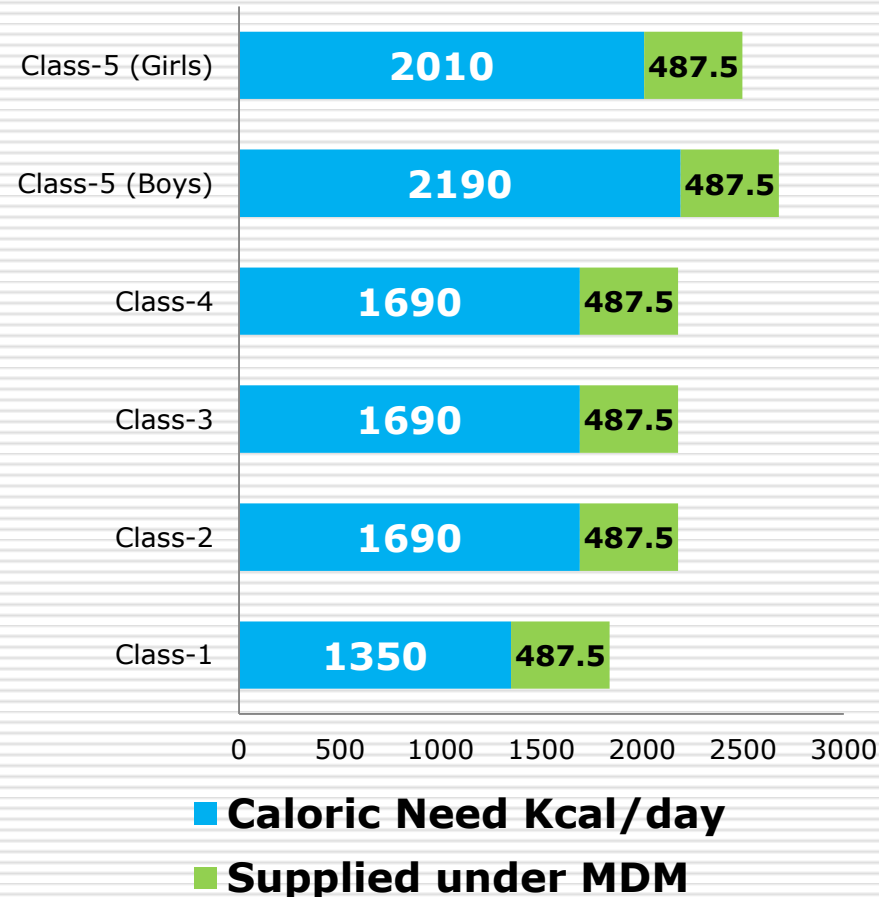

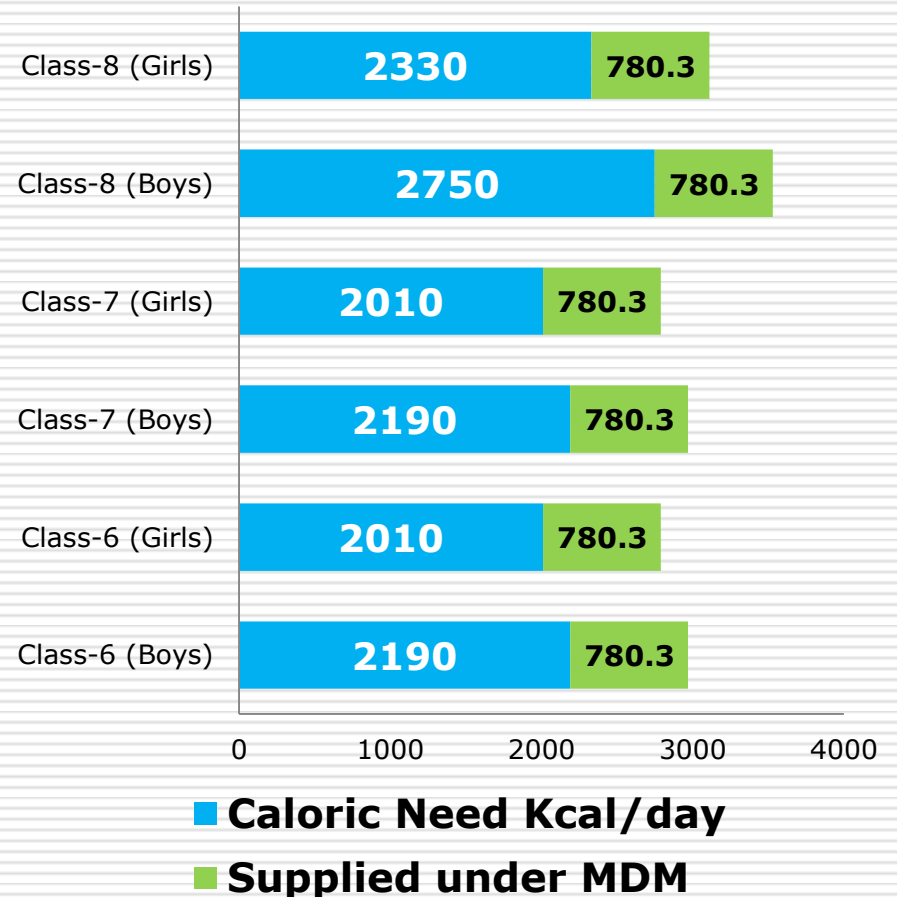

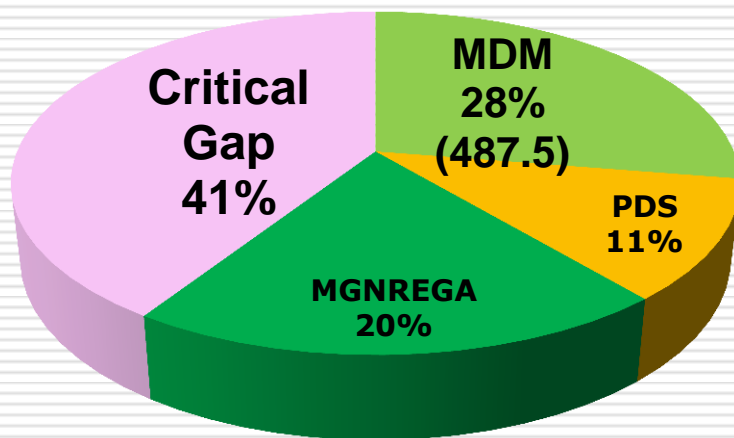
